Sign up for Wowbrary to get an attractive weekly email with cover photos and descriptions of the library's most recent acquisitions. Click through the genre/format columns or customize your weekly email to only see the types of materials that interest you.

Wowbrary serves as a pleasing online version of the new book shelf, but one that includes items that are checked out, and comes by convenient email. The email allows you to click through directly to the library website and place holds.

How do I get the weekly emails?

It's really easy. Go to www.wowbrary.org/signup.aspx. Simply type Williston's ZIP code in the upper left box and hit the Go button to find the sign up for Dorothy Alling Memorial Library.
